

Sun Shines Brightly on 2025 Fall FOC QSO Party by Patrick Barkey, N9RV

It seems hard to believe today, but there were 9 active sunspots on September 27, 2025 when the FOC QSO Party was held. And the hundreds of FOC members and non-members alike got to enjoy perfect early fall conditions to share the fun and camaraderie of friendship over the airwaves in the way that we all love. Sending and receiving CW, of course!

Every FOC QP is special – a twice a year opportunity to get on the air over the same 24-hour period to make contacts on all bands and to refresh connections with members around the globe. Its also a great way to open the door to non-members to say hello and give them a sense of what makes FOC so special. Its great to hear the stories of the lengths to which some of us went to just to get on the air, through antenna problems, bad internet connections, or social obligations.

And those that did make it on for the Fall FOC QP got to enjoy great conditions on 40-10 meters. The propagation helped with the QSO totals of the top stations this year as well, with OM2VL's 1148 overall QSOs (with 911 member contacts) nearly doubling the high QSO total last spring. Scores were up everywhere, with even the US west coast getting in on the action.

Highlights were everywhere. Every contact with OH2EA was a highlight – Hans pushed through his antenna challenges at his new apartment to put 68 members in the log. Middle of the night openings on 20 meters from southern California were a thrill to K6AR. New member HK3CQ put South America in plenty of logs while experiencing his first FOC QP as a member. And it's always a highlight to work our friends in Oceania and Asia when the bands sound empty. Don't forget to point your beams that way, folks, and give them a QSO.

And, of course, there was the thrill of hearing Vic, W9RGB (SK), on the air with a big pile of callers. Thanks to the tireless efforts of K9FN, many of us had the pleasure of conveying our best wishes to Vic in the FOC QP in the way we know best: on the air. He will certainly be missed.

There were plenty of sharp operators from outside the club who got on in a big way to say hello and to fill up our logs on many bands. Thanks to everyone who participated to make this year's fall event special.

The Scores

There are few surprises in the listings of high scorers by continent shown in the table below – these folks are in all of our logs. OM2VL had the most total QSOs and member QSOs during the event, congratulations to Laci on his fine effort from his multi-tower station. With a limited number of stations to work, the stations with the highest totals really pulled away by working all of the bands. The distances between the top totals and the second highest were a bit closer on the other continents – the NA West Coast ranking differed by just a couple of QSOs!

Every year there are some surprisingly big efforts from non-members, either by design or by just getting caught up in the fun and staying in the chair. This year W3MA put 419 members into the log, head and shoulders above the rest. Great show!

Of course, every score is important, because it adds to the CW activity that is the essence of the club. You can see them all listed below as well. Will your call be listed next time? The spring 2026 FOC QP is all set for March 28, I hope the bands are full again.
